## EXODUS The Great Escape

We look forward to having your child in Vacation Bible School this year. The Exodus is the story about God delivering the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. God not only rescued the Israelites but also provided food and water in the wilderness. God gave them rules for right relationships and called them into a covenant relationship. God not only liberated the Israelites from slavery but also liberated them to a relationship with God.

Students are eligible to earn a campship to Drift Creek Camp to help offset registration costs. Points are given each night for the following:

point for being present each evening
point for bringing a Bible each evening
point for memory work completed each evening
point for bringing a friend (2 points maximum for the week)

If you have any questions regarding the point system or memory work, please feel free to talk with your child's group leader or one of the VBS directors.

At the end of the week, campships to will be awarded to all children who earn the following points:

13-15 points	=	\$100 campship
12 points	=	\$80 campship
11 points	=	\$60 campship

Those children not able to attend Drift Creek Camp who earn a minimum of 11 points will be given a small gift in lieu of a campship.

Each evening, an offering will be collected. The proceeds will go to support the Young Women's Seminar in Orodara, Burkina Faso, West Africa, for girls age 11 to 17 years old, to learn life skills and about the Bible.

Students will be dismissed at 8:45 p.m. <u>Your child will need to be picked up by</u> <u>you or another adult behind the roped area</u>. Their safety is important to all of us, especially with the large number of cars in the parking lot at the end of the evening.
