- A new children's book, The Librarian of Basra, tells the true story of one librarian in Iraq who struggled to save a precious book collection from being destroyed in the war.
- Sophie's World—#1 in Faith Girlz series by nancy Rue and Are You There God? It's Me, Margaret by Judy Blume are two new books for youth. Sophis uses new found factics to save a friend from impending humilation by the popular girls.
- Kairos—by Joanne Lehman, a novel that wrestles with hard questions and injustice yet tells the story of love and friendship.
- 3 books by Lauraine Snelling are #4, 5 & 6 in the Red River of the North series: The Reaper's Song, Tender Mercies and Blessing in Disguise.
- Number 1 in Beverly Lewis' new series, Annie's People, The Preacher's
   Daughter is the story of Annie Zook who faces a choice between art and her People.
- A Funny Thing Happened on My Way to Old Age—a light-hearted look at aging by author Stanley Baldwin and how these life changes relate to your Christian life. Fun to read.
- Home to Harmony by Philip Gulley reflects on ways in which spirituality is woven into everyday life. He is described as a breath of fresh air, part Mart Twain, part Garrison Keillor.

Music in Worship—A Mennonite Perspective by Bernie Neufeld. This book is written to be a resource for pastors, worship leaders and church musicians in local congregations.
