- God's People Now! Face to Face With Mennonite Church Canada. Robert J. Suderman shares his reflections on what he heard in his "listening tour" of every Mennonite church in Canada.
- Discerning God's Will Together by Ervin Stutzman. The book highlights congregational discernment in difficult situations as a tool of faithful interpretation in the Anabaptist tradition.
- On My Way: The View From the Ninth Decade. Daniel Hertzler's wisdom and dry wit shine in this further biography that reflects on his thoughtfully lived life.
- Mennonite Tourguide to Western Europe. This is a 2007 version by Jan Gleysteen that will help the traveler to have a meaningful experience. For those who will never get to Europe the book is full of facts and descriptions of its culture and history including the Anabaptist story.

I SHALL NOT HATE By Izzeldin Abulaish

The wealthy Palestinian Abulaish family left their home to avoid deportation when the state of Israel came in to being. Their expected return home after a short stay in Gaza, a place designated for Palestinians, was not realized. The author was born and raised in a Gaza refugee camp. His story describes the fear and poverty of life in the camp that included deliberate destruction of houses in the camp which increased with the intifidas. The subsequent embargos restricted food, medical care and other necessities. His determination to find a way out of the poverty resulted in getting an education that took him beyond those borders to a life of hope. As a medical doctor he worked with Israeli colleagues who had similar love of family and of peace. Both agreed that talking together was crucial to the goal of peace desired by both peoples.

After the tragic deaths of three daughters at the hands of Israeli soldiers Izzeldin has worked for peace. His deepest hope is expressed that his daughters will be "the last sacrifice on the road to peace between Palestinians and Israelis." His is a remarkable commitment to forgiveness and reconciliation and he does not harbor anger toward those who killed the girls...

The message of the book is one well worth reading and pondering.
