MDS Service Opportunity: Bob Smith, Oregon Unit of Mennonite Disaster Service has secured 8 slots for construction workers March 19-25, 2017, rebuilding homes (for handicapped persons) that were destroyed in the Calaveras County fires in 2015. The location is SE of Sacramento, CA. An estimated 475 homes were destroyed by fires. Volunteer accommodations are at the nearby Camp Lodestar, a Methodist retreat center nestled at the 3000 foot level near the town of San Andreas, CA.
