Seeking Saul

An American Mother Journey to Colombia By Rebecca Thatcher Murcia

This is the story of a year long journey taken by Rebecca and her two sons after the premature death of husband and father Saul Murcia. It was a journey to help Gabriel and Mario remember and understand their father, improve their Spanish and spend time with their Colombian relatives.

Saul had left his homeland of Colombia for life in the United States where he attended Goshen College. He and Rebecca met and married in Texas where he worked as a volunteer for the Mennonite Church. They later moved to Akron, PA where he was co-director for Latin America for Mennonite Central Committee.

The story tells of the struggles, joys and frustrations of life in a different culture, Rebecca's concern for her sons as they adjusted to strange food, water shortages and having to get short haircuts. She was often surprised of their acceptance of these differences and willingness to see the bright side.

In the loss of her financial security at the end of their stay she was brought to realize how it is to be poor and walk in solidarity with those among whom she lived.
