Suggested Readings and Reflections for Lent, Week 3 March 13-17

• Exodus 17:1-7

The desire for water is legitimate. So what did the Hebrews do, or neglect to do, that went beyond requesting water? When and how might we engage in similar "striving and testing, with God or with others?"

• Psalm 95

After calling us to listen to God's voice in verse 7, this Psalm gives us a word from God, starting in verse 8. What does God want us to do, or not do? When and how have you experienced the "rest" that God offers?

• Romans 5:1-11

These words were written to people who used to boast about their differences and distance from each other: Jews and Gentiles. What can they boast about now? What are our reasons for peace and hope?

• John 4:5-42

Out of the fourteen people in this story, which of them are evangelists? What changes does Jesus tell the Samaritan woman that he is bringing into the world? What do you think it means to "worship God in spirit and in truth?"

Suggested Lenten Activities from Mennonite Mission Network:

- March 12: Unplug. It's a day of rest.
- **March 13:** Read Micah 6:8 and reflect on how it calls you to ministry in your own setting.
- March 14: Look at a map with a child. Point out states or countries where people you know live. Pray for these people.
- March 15: Read the news for 10 minutes. Then, turn off all your screens for 15 minutes and pray for each of those situations. Talk about it together with your family or friends.
- March 16: Collect aluminum cans from your church (or work, or home, etc.). After you recycle the cans, add the money you earned to your "missions jar."
- **March 17:** Invite a former (or current) mission worker to coffee; ask them to share their story. Pray with them.
- March 18: Spend 20 minutes in nature. Pay attention to the details that are easy to miss in the daily hustle.
