- Romans 4: 1-5; 13-17 In what ways might your relationship with God be like that of Abraham?
- John 3: 1-17 Jesus offered Nicodemus, a powerful and prestigious "leader of the Jews," a second birth into a new life. What would Nicodemus gain in this new birth, and what might he lose?

- March 5: Unplug. It's a day of rest.
- March 6: Lent is a time to focus on God. For the next week, try to keep five of the seven evenings free so you can focus on God's agenda instead of yours.
- **March 7:** Take a prayer walk through your neighborhood to pray for people and issues in your community.
- March 8: On a blank sheet of paper write the verses from Isaiah 58:6–7. Spend some time doodling or thinking about what those verses mean in your life.
- **March 9:** Next time you fill up your car with gas, say a prayer for God's sustaining hand.
- March 10: Don't eat out this weekend. Instead, put the money you saved in a "missions jar." At the end of the month, donate the money toward Mennonite Mission Network's ministries.
- March 11: Visit our new website (MennoniteMission.net) and read about Eric and Kelly Frey Martin and their ministry in Colombia. Pray for them.
