Suggested Readings and Reflections for Lent, Week 4 March 20-24

- Isaiah 50: 4-9a: (This is one of Isaiah's songs of The Suffering Servant, later identified in the Gospels as Jesus)
 How does Jesus fulfill the words of this prophecy?
 Who else now in the world is suffering in a similar way for his/ her faithfulness to God?
- Philippians 2: 5-11
 How does the example of Christ in this passage differ from that
 of Adam (verse 6-7)?
 How does Christ's path to glory (verses 9-11) differ from our
 conventional wisdom about achieving glory?
- Psalm 118: 1-2; 19-29: This psalm is a worship service for the return of a Hebrew king, like David, in triumph, after a battle. From verse 25 we get the word, "Hosanna," Hebrew for "Save us!"

When has God come through in triumph on your behalf? For what in your life can you praise God in similar words of joy?

Matthew 21: 1-11
 Where do you imagine yourself being in this scene if you were present then and there?
 How and why would Jesus come to Jerusalem in a way similar to that of his ancestor, King David, recorded in Psalm 118?
 How is Jesus' triumphal entry to Jerusalem different from that of David?

- **Monday, April 3:** Plan one meal this week that involves only foods that are grown locally.
- Tuesday, April 4: This evening, light a candle and take 15 minutes of intentional time with your family or friends to talk about your day.

- Thursday, April 6: Plant a seed in a flower pot. Read the parable of the sower from Matthew 13:1-9
- **Friday, April 7:** Meet with someone in your community who is from another culture. Invite them over for dinner. Ask them to share their story.
- Saturday, April 8: Volunteer an afternoon to your local food bank.
