Covenant with God Teacher: Lynn Miller, Sanctuary Foyer Classroom Room This study of Scriptures from an Anabaptist perspective begins with "Signs of God's Covenant", then "Called into Covenant with God" from various Old Testament passages. The final four Sundays
explore "An Everlasting Covenant" from Old and New Testament.

In this class we will examine racial identity and privilege, asking, "How might Christians listen and be changed by the stories of those on the racialized margins?" Basic Mennonite Faith Exploration Leader: Mathew Swora Do you wish to know more about Mennonite belief and history, and about Zion Mennonite Church in particular? Wish to explore Christian faith and baptism or membership in Zion MC? Or just want a refresher course?
