Relief kits provide valuable supplies to families whose lives have been disrupted by war or disaster. MCC shipped 16,787 kits last year to Jordan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Democratic Republic of Korea (North Korea), Iraq, Ukraine and Serbia

Contents (NEW items only, in original packaging)

4 large bars bath soap

1 plastic bottle shampoo (13–24 oz; place in resealable plastic bag)

4 large bars laundry soap (Some stores carry Fels Naptha®, Sunlight® or Zote® brands)

Sumignt of Zote bran

4 adult-size toothbrushes

4 new bath towels (medium weight, dark or bright colors)

2 wide-tooth combs (6-8 in)

1 fingernail clipper (good quality)

1 box adhesive bandages (minimum 40 count, assorted)

1 package sanitary pads (18-24 count thin maxi)
