Mathew was grateful for the feedback, and asked us to encourage anyone with thoughts about comprehension, engagement, or other suggestions regarding his sermons to share those directly with him. We also encourage anyone with praise for Mathew's sermons to share that with him as well, since we believe that it is equally important for him to hear what is working for people as what isn't.

From your feedback about his time usage, he will also seek to do more visitations and less administration, or delegate what he can.

At the beginning of January, there was a big rain storm in Santa Cruz, Bolivia. The Santa Cruz Christian Learning Center, where the Amstutz kids studied K-12 and Rebecca Strong currently teaches and Matias and Marcos study, was under 3 feet of water. There is \$35,000 estimated damage and another \$20,000 estimated in repair work on the property to ensure that future rains do not damage the facility in this way again.
