A significant part of MCC's relief work is the Meat Canning that happens throughout the year at locations east of the Rockies. Each year, nearly 600,000 pounds are canned. This year, MCC has requests for 27 containers of meat from 16 partners, but staffing is only available for ½ of the mobile canning crew. If this crew cannot be fully staffed, it may require MCC to reduce its canning capacity. The current projections forecast only being able to send 10 containers to less than 5 partners. While the canning does not take place in our region, MCC asks you to join in praying for this urgent need. Additionally, you may know someone who could serve on the crew. Zion Mennonite Church—125 Years 1893 - 2018

On September 23, 2018, Zion Mennonite Church celebrates 125 years as an established Mennonite congregation. It's a time to recognize and honor the vision that began this congregation and its continuing life in this community. Zion began with formal organization in June 1893, and erected a church building on its present site in the fall of 1898. An overarching scripture captures the faith of Zion Mennonite: "Oh Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations." Psalm 90.

Sunday morning and afternoon are planned with special guest, Dr. John D. Roth, Goshen College professor of history and Director of the Institute for the Study of Global Anabaptism.

Update from the Church Structure Team -- The Structure team is comprised of six members: Dennis Russell, Luanne Berkey, Jeremy Gingerich, Mathew Swora, Frank Howard, and Kevin Hockman-Chupp. We were tasked by the Congregation at the October 2017 Members Meeting with looking at the existing church structure and make a proposal on how we might improve the church structure. We have met four times. As part of our first meeting, we set up goals for what this team is attempting to accomplish:

- Be God focused
- Create an efficient model
- Improve communication
- Simplicity
- Remove layers
- Increase trust
- Focus on vision/mission

We spent the first three meetings working at understanding the existing structure defined in the constitution, documenting the structure graphically, understanding the channels of communication, and talking about what is working and what is not working. During that time we also reviewed structures from Albany Mennonite, Salem Mennonite, and Portland Mennonite. At our last meeting we began to lay out a rough sketch of how we might re-structure. We welcome comments, concerns, hopes, and warnings during this process. Our plans are to do more work on this rough model, then meet with Church Council, Pastoral Leadership Team, and PCRC to discuss what we are seeing. After incorporating their feedback, we will then have a congregational meeting to go over a proposal of structure and constitutional changes. We still have a lot of work ahead of us.
