JUBILEE COMMUNITY GARDEN

One year after the JFP was opened, we presented a proposal to the City of Hubbard to use the green space between 4th and 5th street as a community garden. The city excepted our proposal and provided the water supply for the garden to be built. With help from community members, we constructed a fenced area with 8 garden boxes. The hope is to provide a way for folks in local apartments and guests from the food pantry to have their own garden. One garden box is always dedicated to the Jubilee Food Pantry as another source of fresh produce for guests during the growing season. This is our 8th growing season and currently there are 3 families who care for gardens at the Jubilee



Community Garden (including the Coulombe family). We are always seeking new ways to encourage community gardening.
