Next Sunday, September 23, 2018, Zion Mennonite Church celebrates 125 years as an established Mennonite congregation. Zion began with formal organization in June 1893, and erected a church building on its present site in the fall of 1898. An overarching scripture captures the faith of Zion Mennonite: "Oh Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations." Psalm 90.
