Sing Your Own Messiah Saturday, December 22 at 7:00pm



HELP!!! Do you have a plastic grocery bag stash you can part with? We Need Them! For Jayce's senior project, he wants to help the homeless he drives by on the way to school each day. So, he's going to learn to crochet "Mercy Mats". Each 2 1/2 x 6 foot crocheted rug-type mat would help keep them clean and warm as they sleep. The plastic bags are cut into strips to make "plarn" plastic yarn—and rolled into a ball to knit with. It takes 500-700 BAGS PER MAT so we literally need a bazillion! His project isn't due until May, so keep saving the bags all winter for us. This is recycling at it's best! Also, if you like to crochet (or know someone who does) and would enjoy having a winter project, we'd love to supply you with the pre-made plarn balls so you only need to do the crocheting part. We'd love to get as many mats made as possible by May. There are a lot of 'how to' videos online if you want to look up 'mats for the homeless out of recycled plastic bags' and 'mercy mats'. Feel free to share my contact info with anyone who may be interested in crocheting Mercy Mats with us. Thanks so much!
