Risking Trust in a Fearful World by Sarah Quezada

Sarah Quezada's experience as a young adult moving from the South to landing her dream fun and exciting illustrated biography! job in Los Angeles, California, and immediately encountering masses of people with many different languages seemed overwhelming. This is the story of immigrants and immigration. It becomes a personal story when she is introduced to a handsome young man from Guatemala. As they learn to know one another, she becomes increasingly uncomfortable with the moral issues that faced her when she found out that he was illegal. Quezada, a gifted story teller weaves her own personal story with dialogue and problems of the 'illegal alien'. She shares insight about fear, about being treated unfairly, of being sent back to a dangerous situation, of being stuck in detainment centers. She admits that her own story turned out well, while knowing that it could have gone any number of not-so-good ways.

Alexia Salvatierra writes in the book's forward, "Love Undocumented is a rich resource for anyone seeking to understand our immigration These are the seeds that fell to the ground and crisis; it is full of information and inspiration. First and foremost, however, it is a compelling love story."
