We are deeply grateful for the generous financial support that the Zion BBQ raised, a total of \$8904! Your gifts help bridge the gap caused by the closure. We are also thrilled with the response to September's Slug Run! Thank you, Dave and Julie, for hosting and to the planners for making it a fresh, fun way to gather as a community and support DCC! Meanwhile, progress has resumed on the Caretaker Cabin and we just had our most-attended Fall Quilting Retreat yet! As representatives of DCC, we are grateful for your generous support, and as a family, your prayers have meant the world. Our "road" has not been easy this past year. But knowing that people are praying for us on this journey has made all the difference. I am now 7 weeks post-surgery. Recovery is going more slowly than I had hoped, but I do feel stronger every day. I will begin six weeks of daily radiation treatments after a few more weeks of physical therapy so that I can elevate my arms over my head. From there, it will be determined whether I need to have a complete hysterectomy. Thank you for your continued support for the camp and for our family.
