Lead Pastor Candidate Weekend - February 20-21st

The Pastor Search Committee and ZLT are enthusiastically recommending the candidate for lead pastor at Zion. We are unable to share their name and introduction at this time due to their current employment. The candidate will be joining us to preach on Sunday, February 21st. Typically we use the Sunday School hour and a fellowship meal afterward as a time to get to know them. However, due to Covid, we have had to get a little more creative.

On Saturday, February 20th, you will receive an email with a letter introducing the candidate. Included will be a link to a video "interview" with the candidate, asking questions from the congregation and leadership. A paper copy of the letter will be sent to those who do not receive email.

We ask that you please leave time open on Sunday afternoon, the 21st, as we are working on several ways for people to "distance" meet the candidate. We will be having an affirmation vote on calling the candidate the week following the 21st. As we get closer to the time, more details will be communicated.

Action: We need your help with gathering questions you might like to ask the candidate. ZLT will be taking some questions from our interviews with the candidate and some questions from the congregation and grouping them by like themes. This set of questions will then be asked to the candidate as part of the Interview Video we are creating for you to see. I hope you and your families are able to read through Lesson 37. Based on Matthew 5-7, and

focused on Matthew 5:14; 5:43-45; 7:12, there is so much good info helping us to understand these

important words in the Bible. For example in my NIV Bible Matt 5:48 says for us to be" perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect". I was thinking, this is so unrealistic! – how can I be? even though of course I want to try! But the lesson explains that as it is written in Greek, perfect "implies wisdom and maturity more than our definition of perfection". I think it's important when we are reading our Bibles to pray about it when we don't understand something and also to investigate-I like to check several translations to figure out how it applies to me. One easy thing to do is go to biblegateway.com and plug in a verse and then flip through different translations. Try reading Matt 5:48 in "The Message" to see how different that reads.
