

Sometimes this time of waiting for Easter can be confusing. What is this time for? Lent might be described as the 40 days—not

Including Sundays!—from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Christians around the world consider Lent a time to reflect on what Jesus did for us.

Remember how John the Baptist expressed a need to prepare the way for Jesus through repenting? Lent is a time, too, to get our hearts ready to truly appreciate Jesus' death for us and celebrate Easter. Because Jesus' death was the

greatest sacrifice ever—some people fast, giving up certain foods or behaviors to remember Him. A fast means taking a break from something--it might be a fast from complaining, TV, sugar, social media, fast food, backtalk, even video games. It means learning to appreciate the Giver more than the gifts.

Ask yourself questions like, "What's one thing that sometimes becomes too important to me? What's one thing that, instead of doing it, I could be hanging out with God?" The answer will be different for each of you.

This week, remember that God doesn't care how big the thing is that we choose to give up for Him, he just wants us to want to spend more time with him
