Recyclers: Thank you for your efforts and enthusiasm for our Terracycle recycling opportunities. A lot of food packaging containers (berry baskets, salad green boxes, bakery clamshells) have been showing up in the dropoff bags--please note: these are NOT recyclable through this program. The Rubbermaid food storage container recycling program offered through Terracycle is intended for containers meant for long-term food storage that have reached the end of their useful life (Tupperware, Rubbermaid, freezer containers, etc). Please do not collect disposable plastic food packaging for this program. It goes in the trash! Other options: avoid buying these pre-packaged items; take #6 containers and styrofoam to Agilyx in Tigard (13240 SW Wall St, Tigard); consider purchasing a Zero-waste recycling box from Terracycle: zerowasteboxes.terracycle.com. Clackamas County continues to accept plastic tubs (yogurt, cottage cheese, etc) at least 6oz in volume in curbside recycling--no lids.
