Update from Oregon Unit of Mennonite Disaster Service:

The counties effected by the wildfires last August/September 2021 are begging to get a scope of work for the recovery efforts. Several of the Long Term Recovery Committees (LTRCs) are getting their Disaster Case Managers trained and are developing case loads of survivors. Many of the Unmet Needs Round table committees are hearing cases and allocating money, manpower, and material to meet survivor needs. At this time, Clackamas Co. LTRC is beginning to do home construction with donated labor and materials from local businesses and contractors in the Estacada area. MDS has been able to work with the county in providing house plans for these builds. Construction volunteer labor will be needed at later dates as counties determine which clients have unmet needs.
