#### Associate Pastor Review Summary for Jana Gingerich

PCRC received 31 reviews for Jana, processed them and presented the comments from the review to Jana. People's names were removed from the comments and held in confidence by PCRC members. Below is a synopsis of the review. Thanks to all who participated.

Comments given expressed that Jana is clearly demonstrating the love of God that flows through her into the relationships she has with the congregation. Jana has demonstrated growth in preaching and in worship leading and is perceived as becoming more and more comfortable in those roles. She demonstrated tremendous resilience during pastoral transitions and the pandemic. Jana was seen as a stabilizing force during troubled times. She also received positive recognition for her work in Stephens Ministries as well as being a person who is seen as dependable and available in times of troubles. She is perceived as "loyal, faithful, diligent, humble and committed". Those who specifically rated Jana's over-all performance clearly demonstrate that the congregation fully supports her and desires her continued ministry in this role.

Specific suggestion as to "growth" areas for Jana include taking a personal retreat, perhaps attending seminary or college classes, set "boundaries" in terms of what she will do based on her responsibilities, continue to release day to day work "details" to others, and demonstrate some level of outreach to the community.

PCRC members along with ZLT highly recommend Jana's continued employment under this job description and are fully supportive of Jana's work at Zion.
