Jerry's Bio: I was born and raised in Hillsboro, Kansas. My great-grandfather and family were part of the emigration of the Gnadenau Krimmer Mennonite Brethren in 1874. They settled in the Hillsboro area. I attended Tabor College and received my B.A. in Business Administration and later attended the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary and earned my Master of Divinity Degree. My wife, Margery, and I spent 7 years with Mennonite Central Committee in 3 assignments in Hong Kong, West Bank, Israel, and Swaziland in Southern Africa. In 1995, I began my work with Hope Village, serving as CEO until I retired in 2010. Soon after we moved to Dallas, Oregon, in 1988, I became associated with the Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society. I have served as president, treasurer and manager of the construction of the archives at Zion Mennonite Church. In 2006, I took part in a historical journey to Ukraine and the Crimea. I was able to visit the village where my great grandfather lived and then visited the Crimea where my grandfather was born.
