ANABAPTISM *at* FIVE HUNDRED

For the 500th Anniversary of Anabaptism we will focus one Sunday for the next 4 months (February 16, March 9, April 6, May 18) on our Anabaptist roots with others around the world. You are welcome to join the Anabaptist History Class led by Jerry Barkman in the Skylight Room (February 2, 9, 16, 23, & March 2) where there is an informative Anabaptist Timeline displayed along with other pieces lent to us from the congregation.

Menno Simons, a Catholic priest in the Netherlands, latched on to a new way of thinking and began teaching Anabaptist values in the 1500's and articulated the sentiment of early Anabaptists through scripture: I Corinthians 3:11: "No one can lay any other foundation besides the one that is already laid, which is Jesus Christ." No one – not the emperor, not the pope – can lay a foundation other than the one already laid by Christ.

Our focus on the history of the Anabaptist tradition gives us an opportunity to reaffirm our desire to live as followers of Jesus while new insights and resources enhance our faithful living. Poet, author, and civil rights activist Maya Angelou said in an interview with the Academy of Achievement, "You can't really know where you are going until you know where you have been." How can we share our stories and history in meaningful ways? How does a deeper awareness of our past help us understand where we are and where we are going?
